#### **Gibson County Center - Spring 2011**

#### **History of the Gibson County Center**

The State Board of Education approved the creation of Dyersburg State Community College in 1967. The first classes were offered in fall 1969. A grant from the Tennessee Law Enforcement Agency helped subsidize classes in police science, which were offered in Trenton in 1973. During 1987 Dyersburg State Community College President Dr. Karen Bowyer and the community leaders in Gibson County began to explore the idea of a higher education facility in Gibson County. In August 1988, Governor McWherter promised to provide state matching funds if the local community could raise \$500,000. \$718,477.46 was raised for the new facility.

The newly constructed Gibson County facility next to Peabody High School in Trenton was opened on December 19, 1991. Classes began in January, 1992. On January 28, 1994, the Tennessee Higher Education Commission upon the recommendation of the Tennessee Board of Regents approved the establishment of an educational center in Gibson County and the extension of Associate of Science and Associate of Applied Science degree programs to that center.

Since it opened in 1992, 951 DSCC graduates have enrolled in one or more courses at the DSCC Gibson County Center, located in Trenton across from Peabody High School. In addition 6,137 students have attended classes at this center.

The Center houses six master classrooms, four of which include Sympodium systems; an ITV interactive classroom; a mathematics lab with 30 computer lab stations; a computer lab with 20 computer stations; a Learning Resource Center equipped with 14 computers; and a combination science

Dyersburg State Community College is an open access, learning-centered institution that serves seven counties in West Tennessee. Learning is enhanced by a variety of campus organizations, state of the art technology, service learning opportunities, and sports programs.
