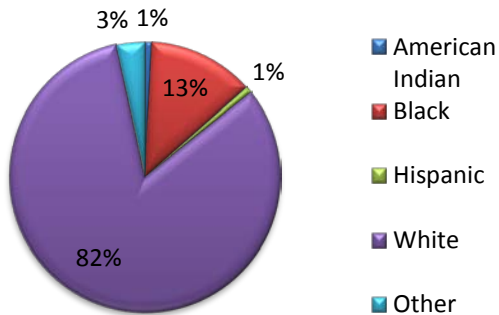

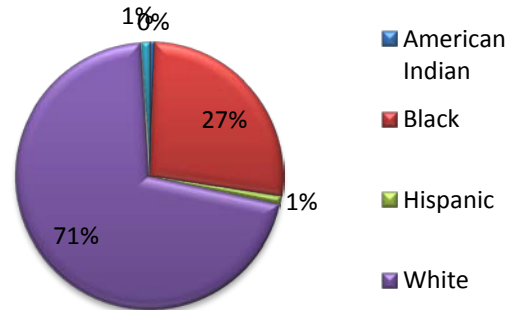

Male Headcount by Race

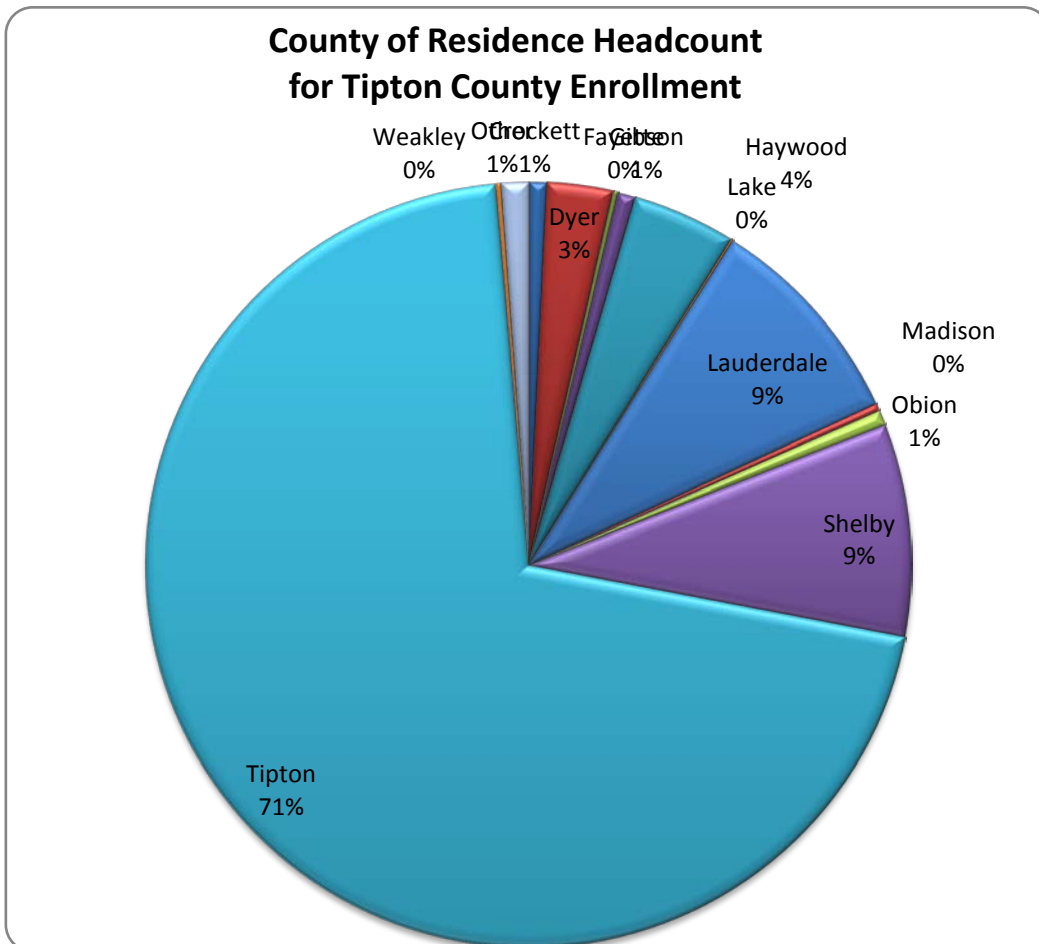


Female Headcount by Race
