Male Headcount

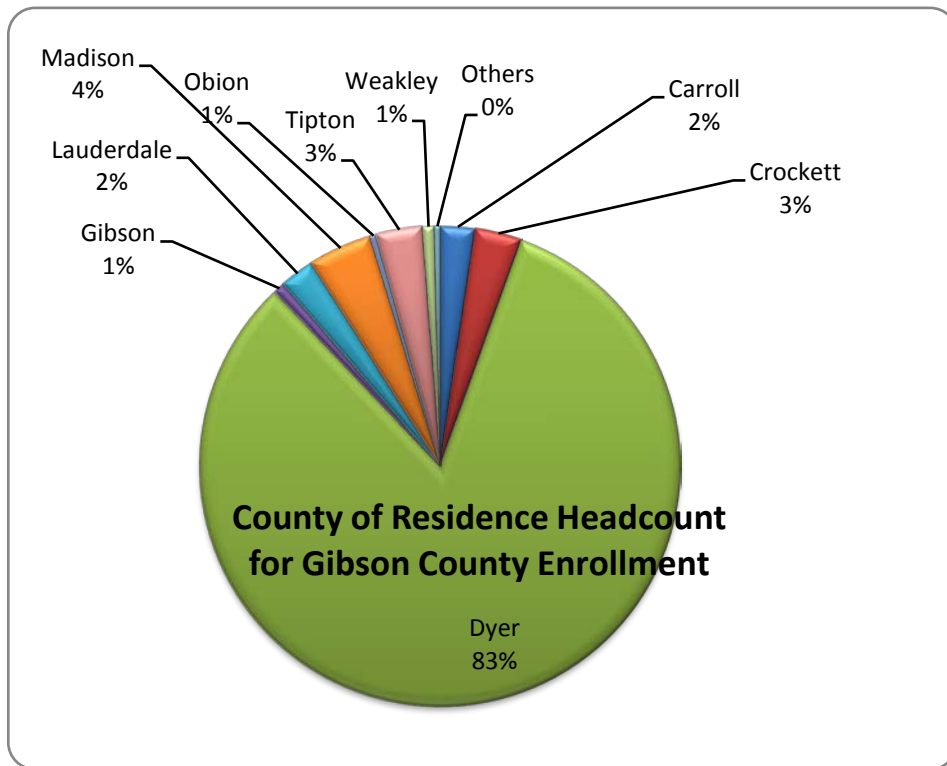


Female Headcount
