## MESSAGE FROM **THE PRESIDENT**

Fiscal year 2023 was a year of growth for Dyersburg State Community College. Our Fall 2023 census enrollment demonstrated over a 15% growth in student headcount and an 8% growth in Full-time Equivalency (FTE) enrollment. On July 1, we opened our Henry County Center and offered our first classes there in August. Dyersburg State has been welcomed in the Henry County community, and we hosted a standing-room-only open house and ribbon cutting on September 20.

We have expanded our early college programs throughout our service area, experiencing approximately 37% growth in dual enrollment in the fall. On short notice, at the request of the Tennessee Board of Regents, Dyersburg State opened an entrepreneurial EMS workforce training program in Haywood County at Blue Oval City, where students train to earn their Basic Emergency Medical Technician and Advanced Emergency Medical Technician Certificates while serving as backup for the local ambulance service. In September 2022 and April 2023, the College dedicated the Dr. Karen A. Bowyer Mathematics Building and the Dr. Carl Christian Andersen Hall in honor of its second and third president of Dyersburg State. Patriot Bank Soccer field at the Jimmy Naifeh Center was dedicated on October 13. Dyersburg State was recognized at the Dyersburg/Dyer County Chamber of Commerce Awards Banquet as the 2023 Large Business of the Year.

This annual report is a snapshot of the accomplishments of our Dyersburg State Family, and for Dyersburg State, we have a bright future ahead!

## ABOUT DYERSBURG STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Dyersburg State Community College (DSCC) was founded in 1969 by the State Board of Education as the second community college in West Tennessee. In 1969, DSCC opened its doors with approximately 500 students. Today, Dyersburg State provides higher education to thousands of students at three locations: the Dyersburg campus, the Jimmy Naifeh Center at Tipton County, and the Henry County Center in Paris. These convenient locations help serve the communities of Crockett, Dyer, Haywood, Henry, Lake, Lauderdale, Obion, Tipton, and Weakley counties. Dyersburg State has become a major resource for workforce development and training for regional business and industry.

Offering courses in the arts and sciences; career, technical and distance education; and nursing; Dyersburg State provides high-quality career programs and courses for traditional and nontraditional students. These programs and courses are designed to enable students to obtain a certificate and/or associate degree for professional career opportunities or to easily transfer to a four-year university through the Tennessee Transfer Pathways program. In addition, eligible students may participate in a dual admission program with partnerships offered through the University of Tennessee at Martin and Middle Tennessee State University. Dyersburg State also offers guaranteed admission through an agreement with the University of Tennessee at Knoxville.

Instruction is delivered through traditional in-person classes, synchronous Zoom teleconferencing and asynchronous online instruction. Dyersburg State offers a very successful dual enrollment program to eligible high school juniors and seniors. The College also provides learning support courses to prepare students for college-level courses. The Division of Workforce Development offers online and in-person learning opportunities through certificate programs, customized workforce development instruction for local businesses and industries, personal enrichment courses and youth programs. Enriching the culture of West Tennessee through its performing and fine arts programs, Dyersburg State hosts a variety of music concerts and recitals, theatrical productions and art exhibits. Students also have the opportunity to study abroad through the Tennessee Consortium for International Studies (TnCIS).

An Academic Success Center (ASC) is available at each location and offers free tutoring and other resources students need to succeed, such as Accuplacer preparation, printing services, computer lab space, and Zoom teleconferencing stations. The Dyersburg campus provides free access to school supplies and personal hygiene items. Each location offers free access to on-site food pantries where students can obtain nonperishable food items and basic necessities to meet their immediate needs.

The Dyersburg campus is centrally located in the College's nine-county area and is spread over more than 115 acres. In each of the following buildings, you will find state-of-the-art technology: the E.B. Eller Administration Building, the Dale F. Glover Education Center, a Learning Resource Center, a Student Center featuring the Karlgaard One Stop Center to provide multiple services to students, such as, The Dr. Karen A. Bowyer Mathematics Building, Dr. Carl Christian Anderson Hall that includes the 148-seat First Citizens National Bank Auditorium, the Security Bank Community Learning Center, and the E.H. Lannom, Jr. Gymnasium.

The Jimmy Naifeh Center at Tipton County, situated on 102 acres in Covington, was constructed in four phases. The first phase opened in 1996. The center currently consists of three main buildings including the 33,503 square-foot Jimmy Naifeh Building, which houses instructional classrooms, labs, a commons area, an advising center and an on-site bookstore. The Baptist Memorial Health Care Academic Building supports the Nursing, Emergency Medical Services, Paramedic, Engineering Systems Technology, and Criminal Justice programs and includes a 244-seat auditorium. In fall 2014, the College celebrated the grand opening of a 54,000 square foot Learning Resource Center, Student Center and Tipton County Public Library. This building offers students and users of the public library access to over 400-computers. Other features include classrooms and computer labs, the Dr. Loren and Elaine Ellis Crown Academic Success Center, the Peter Fyfe Genealogy Room, a children's library, Duke's Café, the Rose Companies Children's Multi-Purpose Lab and Performance Area, and a lab for recreation and physical fitness. The office of Jimmy Naifeh, Speaker Emeritus, Tennessee House of Representatives, is located near the front entrance.

The Henry County Center (HCC) is located at the Henry County Central School Building in Paris, Tennessee. The HCC has administrative offices and classrooms to support students' educational goals. The HCC supports traditional and nontraditional students pursuing general education courses, dual enrollment credit courses, associate degrees through the Tennessee Pathways, certificate programs and non-credit credentials.

## **Dyersburg State Partners with Baptist Memorial Health Care to Increase Emergency Medical Services Practitioners in Rural West Tennessee**

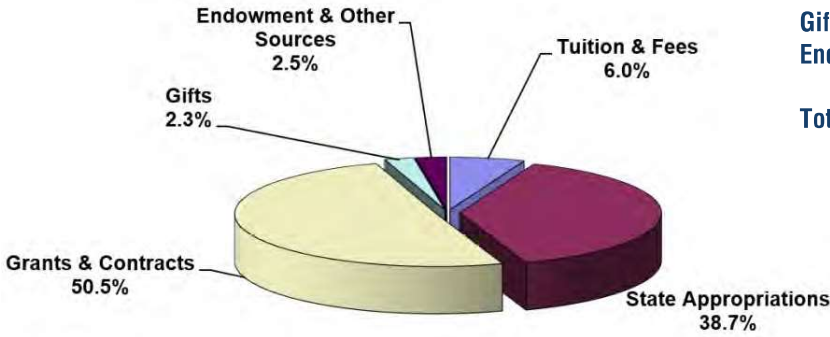

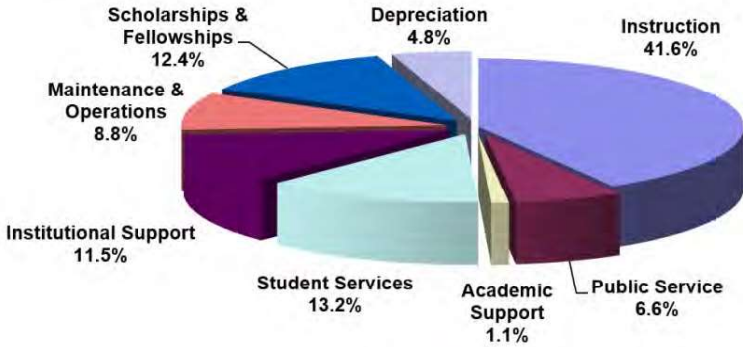


**Revenues for the year ended June 30, 2023**



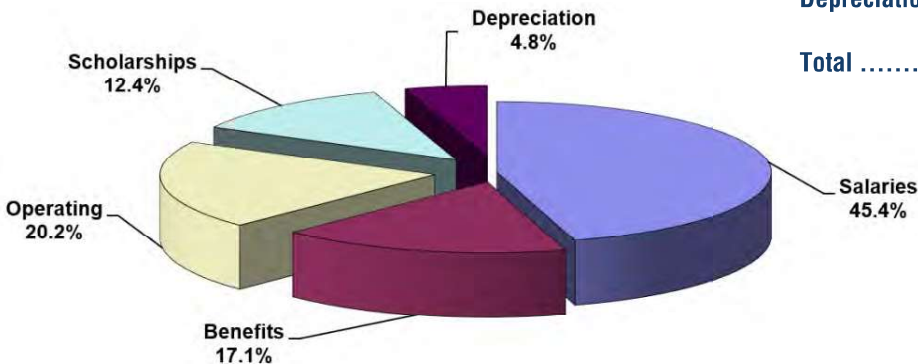

Mr. Larry White is a well-known business and community leader. White owns and operates two Insurance Divisions that employ over 400 employees. Since the late 1970s, many Dyersburg residents have been able to call Mr. Larry White their local insurance agent.

White served in the United States Marine Corps, where he advanced to the rank of Sergeant during his tour of duty in Vietnam. After serving in the Marine Corps, White took classes at DSCC and earned a bachelor's degree in Business Administration from UT Martin.

Over the years, White has served as a board member and chairman for many organizations such as the Dyersburg State Community College Foundation, Dyersburg Rotary Club, the University of Tennessee, Dyersburg Regional Hospital, Reelfoot Rural Ministries, Dyersburg/Dyer County Chamber of Commerce, and First Citizens National Bank.

White has generously supported Dyersburg State Community College and the University of Tennessee at Martin as a scholarship donor. More than 100 deserving DSCC students have benefited from his generosity. He has served on the Dyersburg State Community College Foundation Board of Directors since 2001 and was the board chair from 2011 until 2014. He still serves today on the Executive Committee. In addition to donating his time, he and his business, White and Associates, Inc., have contributed over \$118,000 to DSCC. White has volunteered for many community fundraising efforts, such as those sponsored by the Rotary Club, the American Red Cross, and the Salvation Army.

White has been a long-time member of the First United Methodist Church. He has served as a Sunday school teacher and a committee chairman for his church. He and his wife, Kay have been married for 48 years. They are the parents of one daughter, Whitney White Allmon, and the grandparents of three grandchildren.

When we asked Larry what he liked best about attending DSCC, he said, "after returning from the military, DSCC made it much easier for me to continue my education. They have been so much a part of our community and watching them help others as they helped me get my college degree."

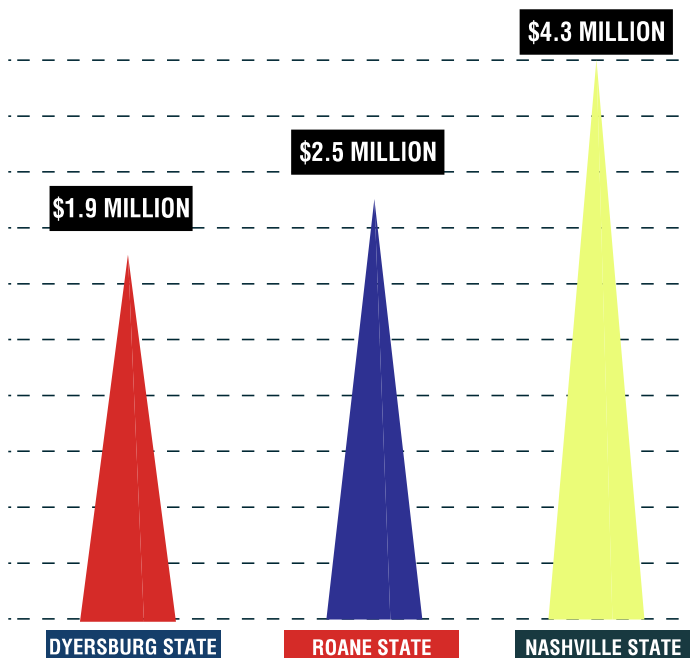
